Plants for Windy, Exposed Sites

Areas in exposed, windy places need a special plant palette to succeed. Weak-wooded plants can break in strong winds, and those with large leaves can tear and burn. These plants are adapted to sunny, wind-swept areas and may also tolerate bad soils.
